United Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 11, 2023

Members Present: Scott Urwiler, Dustin Showen, Drew Detlefsen, Joe Ankeny, Kody Urwiler, Jon Mullen, Sara Pehrson, Tiffany Ebberson, Pastor Matt Quanbeck.

Members Absent: Nate Abts, Lisa Karnes, Tom Biernbaum and Erica Diediker

Devotions and prayer led by Jon Mullen.

Tiffany Ebberson read last month's minutes. Joe Ankeny made the motion to approve the minutes. Kody Urwiler seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: In Lisa's absence, Scott passed out the balance and P/L reports. Council reviewed the reports and no questions were raised. Drew Detlefsen made the motion to approve the report. Jon Mullen seconded. Motion passed.

Trustee's Report: Kody Urwiler brought up that the stump removal in the south parking lot had been tabled until spring. "Do we need to keep this on the spring agenda?" Hartington Tree had previously given a quote of approximately \$2,400 for stump grinding and removal and \$2,600 for clean up and back fill of dirt. Drew noted that they would be doing work at the school. They could do the clean-up with one of their trucks instead of hiring it done. Kody made the motion to have the stumps ground if the cost is around \$2,400. Drew Detlefsen seconded. Motion passed.

Parish Ed Report: Sara Pehrson reported that currently the Luther League account has \$5,033 (these funds are to be used towards the FLY Convention) and the Parish Ed account has \$10,080. Two students are no longer attending the FLY Convention so there is currently 9 youth and 3 chaperones attending. The kids have approximately \$3,212 more to raise. The youth group plans to have more fundraising events. The first FLY payment is now due. Sara noted that 1 student has applied for scholarship to Camp Assurance and has been approved.

Deacon's Report: Drew Detlefsen reported that the Call Committee has met and revised the current youth worker job description to meet the full-time position requirements.

Pastor's Report: Equipping Focus: Pastor has been discussing with the deacons what it looks like to "shepherd" our church well. A majority of the time people are cared for well but, there are times some people "fall through the cracks." An area of focus is caring for families after a loved one dies. Teaching Focus: Confirmation is to be held May 21st. Pastor is planning a preaching series based on 1 Timothy for the summer. Also, Pastor made us aware that he has had some interest from people to join the church. A new member class is in the works. Vision Moment: Luke 14:12-14 was discussed. "What does it mean to take initiative in building friendships in the church?" "How about welcoming new people to church?" "How about in our relationships outside of church?"

Injuries are a leading cause of disability for people of all ages – and they are the leading cause of death for Americans ages 1 to 44. The good news is everyone can get involved to help prevent injuries.

During National Safety Month, this June, we encourage you to learn more about important safety issues like prescription painkiller abuse, transportation safety, and slips, trips, and falls.

- **Prescription painkiller abuse:** Prescription painkiller overdoses are a growing problem in the United States, especially among women. About 18 women die every day from a prescription painkiller overdose more than 4 times as many as back in 1999.
- **Transportation safety:** Doing other activities while driving like texting or eating distracts you and increases your chance of crashing. Almost 1 in 5 crashes (17%) that injured someone involved distracted driving.
- **Slips, trips, and falls:** One in 4 older adults falls each year. Many falls lead to broken bones and other health problems.


